O Jesus, blasphemed, accused, and wrongfully condemned – have mercy on me, and teach me to endure the mistreatment of others.

O Jesus, clothed with a habit of reproach and shame – have mercy on me, and let me not seek my own glory.

O Jesus, insulted, mocked, and spit upon – have mercy on me, and let me not falter or fail in the fiery trials of life.

O Jesus, crowned with thorns and hailed in derision;

O Jesus burdened with our sins and the curses of the people;

O Jesus affronted, outraged, buffeted, overwhelmed with injuries, griefs, and humiliations;

O Jesus hanging on the accursed tree, bowing the head, giving up the spirit – have mercy on me, and conform my whole mind, heart, and soul – to be your holy, humble, suffering servant. AMEN!
